Restoration Century – We promote ecologically-based restoration projects that provide rural communities with jobs in road removal, watershed restoration and fuel reduction.

Influencing the Marketplace – We mobilize consumer pressure to influence corporations to stop using wood derived from endangered national forests.

National Forest Protection and Restoration Act (NFPRA) - NFPRA would redirect the billion-dollar timber sale subsidy to protect clean water and wildlife, provide forest restoration jobs, save tax dollars and help communities prepare for wildland fire.

Just Consider These Facts:

- Over 95% of native forests have been logged. Most of the remaining 5% lie on public lands but are destroyed by taxpayer-subsidized logging.
- Taxpayers spend over \$1 billion annually subsidizing logging companies to cut down our treasured national forests - all to supply 2% of our nation's wood products.
- There are 445,000 miles of roads on our national forests – enough to circle the Earth 18 times – and the Forest Service faces a \$10 billion road maintenance backlog.
- On our national forests alone, 421 endangered species are faced with extinction and another 2,900 species are designated as “sensitive” to extinction.



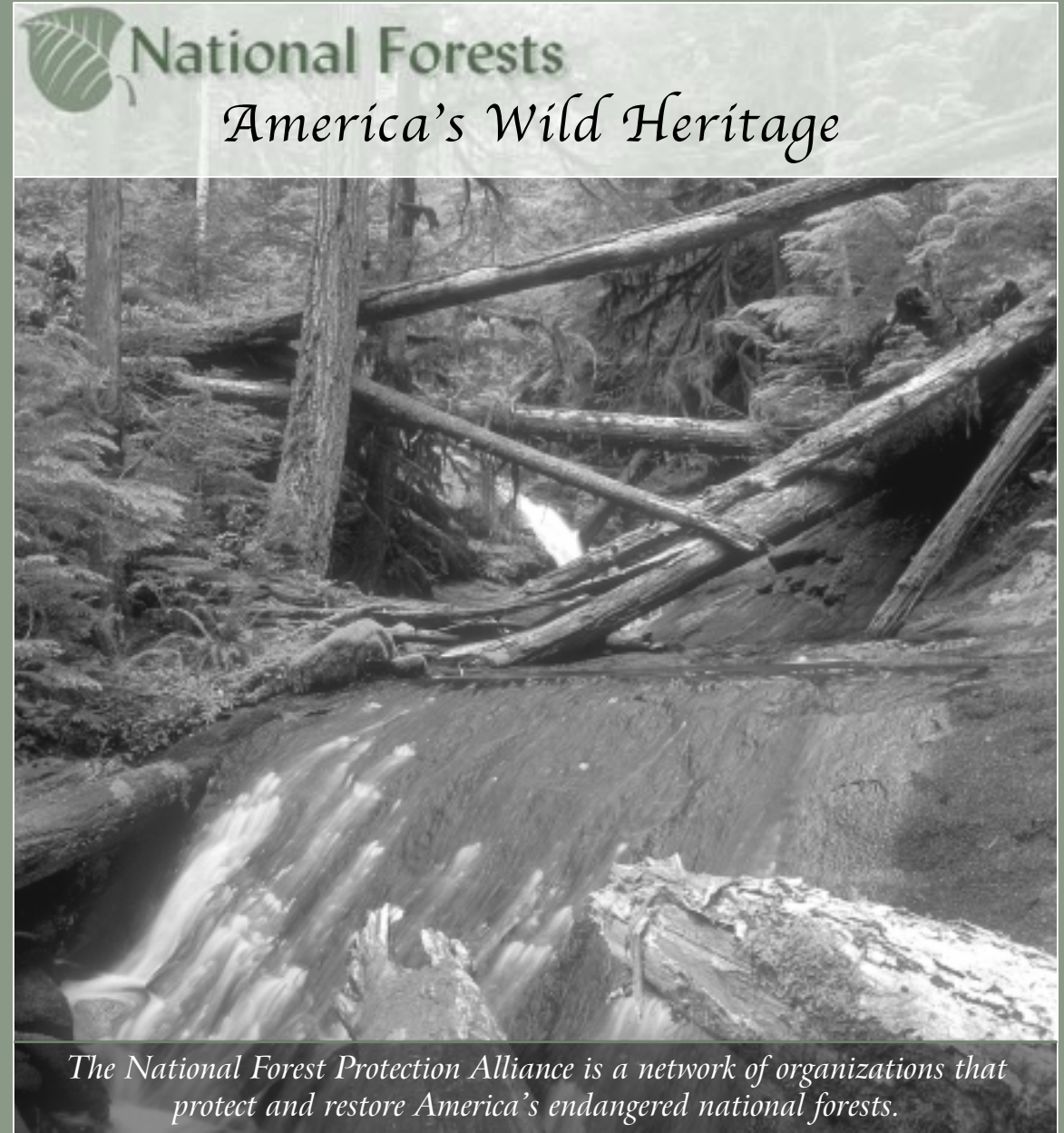
